

- -Nonverbal Communication
- -Social Interaction
- -This is generally evident before the age of three

Other Characteristics Associated with Autism

*Engagement in repetitive activities and stereotyped movements

*Resistance to environmental change or change in daily routines

*Unusual responses to environmental change in daily routines, such as sounds and/or light

Business Department Helpful Tip

In Elementary School is not too Early to Think and Plan for your Child's College Education.

According to the U.S. Department of Education, here are some helpful tips to help you achieve that goal.

*Coverdell Education Saving Account: it allows up to \$2,000 a year to be put aside for a student's education expenses (elementary, secondary, or college).

*Qualified Tuition Programs (QTP's also known as 529 Plans): established by state or school so that you can either prepay or save up to pay education-related expenses. Once in college you withdraw money from your account to pay your education expenses, the money you withdraw will not be taxed.

Lastly, take advantage of the tools the U.S. Department of Ed. provides for you to prepare for the future of your child.

The following are steps to become a School Bus Driver:

- Original School Bus Driving Class (about 35 hours)
- DMV Physical
- DMV Commercial License (4 tests)
- · Written Exam with CHP
- First Aide Course or may take written exam with CHP
- · 20 Hours, Behind the Wheel Training
- · Drive Test with CHP
